<u>Semester 2 reports will go home on Friday 13</u> December.



5000 Origami Butterflies to be installed in Armidale for International Day of Disability

An installation of 5000 origami butterflies is to be suspended over the laneway between Cinders Lane and Armidale's Mall to mark the International Day of Disability.

The ephemeral public art work, which will be in place from 7am until 7pm on Thursday 12th December, is the creation of Armidale artist Genevieve Tavener.

"I was inspired by the story of Hiroshima-born Sadako who had contracted the 'atom bomb disease' - leukemia," Genevieve said. "Sadako recalled a Japanese legend that prompted her to begin folding 1000 paper cranes. She believed that it would make her healthy again."

Unfortunately Sadako died before completing her task. The cranes however, were completed by others on her behalf after her death and the story remains a powerful symbol of strength and hope.

"I understand that 1 in 5 Australians has a disability. So in theory, 5000 Armidale residents could be living with disability," said Genevieve, who lives with disability herself. "This is the reason why I have chosen to create 5000 origami butterflies."

The butterflies will hang in a rainbow above the laneway on the International Day of Disability.

"I have been working with children from St Mary's school to create the butterflies," Genevieve said. "This process has added another layer to the artwork as the butterflies are all a little different. Each one is unique, but together they will appear as a colourful mass."

Armidale Dumaresq Council's Public Art Advisory Panel has supported Genevieve in her plans to create the temporary public art installation. She has also received support in the form of public liability insurance cover through 'Care for Children with Disabilities'.

"The Public Art Advisory Panel is very happy to support Genevieve in this project which will make a powerful and quite beautiful public statement," said Cr Chris Halligan, Chair of the Public Art Advisory Panel. "I am looking forward to the opportunity to experience this artwork by walking under the butterfly-filled canopy of the laneway on December 12th."
