STAGE 3 CANBERRA EXCURSION

Last week 102 excited children and 6 teachers headed off for an adventure in Canberra. Our week was filled with activities from which the students gained a lot of knowledge and experience. Many of the students were able to see the High Court of Australia in action and all of the students witnessed the Senate in operation. Learning about the electoral process was a very valuable experience. Touring Parliament House and having the opportunity to role-play the process of debating a Bill proved to be very educational.

The National Gallery, the Mint, the National Museum, the Australian War Memorial and the National Dinosaur Museum all offered wonderful insights into our cultural history.

Questacon and the CSIRO Discovery Centre both provided a diverse range of activities to peak the students' science interests. The AIS was very interesting as was Cockington Green, Telstra Tower and Mt Ainslie Lookout.

On Friday, 102 weary students and teachers returned to Armidale having had a fabulous time!

The opportunity for the students to visit Canberra and participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy was, in part assisted by the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) program. The PACER grant contributes \$30 per student to assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.
