PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

As the year draws to a close, I would like to recognise our staff, students and community for their resilience during 2020. In the last twelve months we have experienced drought, bushfires, flooding, a pandemic and damaging storm. Let us hope that the air remains clear, any fires are easily controlled, the rain replenishes water reserves without doing damage and our community remains free of COVID-19 into the future and especially in 2021.

This last week has been extremely busy. The stormy weather held off and we managed to finalise water safety lessons for students in Years 3 - 6 last Friday. Our primary students have been able to finish the year with a fun day at the pool this morning. Mr Commen's class ventured out for an excursion to Mt Yarrowyck instead. Next Tuesday, students in K-2 will have the opportunity to have some fun under the sprinklers. Please understand that we will be using the tank water so that we still comply with the council's water restrictions.

Celebrating our own

Yesterday was an extremely busy day. We started the day with our strings group and orchestra performing two concerts for students and staff, the first for K-2 and then 3-6. It was the first opportunity this year for these students to perform for an audience. The strings group performed two very different pieces Matchmaker and Liebertango, accompanied by their teacher, Laura

Carotta. The orchestra then played Perhaps, Perhaps, Perhaps followed by a piece from Raiders of the Lost Ark and finished with Jingle Bell Rock. We took this opportunity to recognise Laura, who has worked with our orchestra for a number of years.

A special assembly was held yesterday afternoon, where forty students were presented with a special certificate recognising their efforts in excelling with honour throughout Term 4. We also had the opportunity to recognise Mrs MacGregor and Mrs Thomas for 30 Years of Service with the Department of Education. Students and staff showed great pride when acknowledging these two long-serving staff members.



In addition, we held our second raffle for the year to recognise students for their positive attendance. Students who have maintained 100% attendance for the first eight weeks of this term were placed in two draws (K-2 and 3-6) for \$40 vouchers to the movies. The following five draws of the raffle for a \$10 K-Mart voucher included students maintaining five or less days of justified absence as well as those with 100%. Damaging winds

Last weekend our school was impacted by strong winds.
