#### <u>Pedestrian Safety</u>

The children have taken the safety information on board and are helping their parents understand how to use pedestrian crossings. We are very proud of our younger children being strong by insisting that parents follow the rules.

#### <u>Reports</u>

Final touches are currently being made to the Semester 2 reports. Reports will be distributed on Monday, 13 December. This semester's reports reflect an unprecedented period of education during the COVID-19 pandemic and has been adjusted to cater for students learning from school and at home. Please be aware that all students may not have covered the same syllabus outcomes or content during this time. This report will not grade student achievement using the A-E scale but may use word descriptors where appropriate. The teacher's comments will focus on English and Mathematics as well as learning that students have undertaken in other subject areas. This report will also provide information about student attendance.

#### Class organisation for 2022

As we prepare class allocations for the new year, teachers have been giving a great deal of thought to the best placement of students for learning and wellbeing. The determination of classes will be based on student need and numbers, with some composite classes in the K-2 area of the school and all classes in 3-6 being stage-based.

To prepare students for the new academic year, we are planning to hold a transition day for students across our school. This will allow our students to

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meet with teachers who will be working on their stage | 1B Class News in 2022, with at least one of these people likely to be your child's teacher. To remain COVID-safe, students will remain in a designated classroom during transition and teachers will move between classes. Classrooms will be cleaned prior to students returning to their usual classroom.

#### Presentation Day notes

As mentioned in last week's Blue and White, we will be doing things a little differently when celebrating Presentation Day this year. To allow all families the opportunity to see their children presented with awards we will be recording the day and uploading two videos to the school website - one for the Kindergarten to Year 2 cohort and a second for students in Years 3 to 6. Last year parents could only see the proceedings during the live streamed event. A link to the video will be provided to parents via School Stream and email.

Permission to Publish notes will only be provided to students receiving an award and all Year 6 students who will be presented with their Primary School completion certificates on 10 December. Students not involved in a presentation will be seated out of view and will not require a note.
