



PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Yesterday, I had the privilege of meeting with our Student Representative Council to discuss leadership. The students had prepared a range of interesting questions for me to answer in relation to my journey to becoming a principal. Even our youngest students were involved in asking questions, supported by their older peers. I believe that the SRC will be inviting other members of the community to learn more about how and why people become leaders.

We have had a number of student teams compete in the past week. Congratulations go to our boy's soccer team who won their match and progressed to the next level, our girls touch team who played well but went down in their game and to our boys and girls gymnastics teams. Two boys' and one girls' team took out first place in their divisions. A special mention goes to Lyla Mack Freddi Violet Edden Lilah Rebbecca Ayalla on taking out a gold medals in gymnastics.

Student attendance

Although students are required to stay home when unwell, we still need to ensure that parents are reminded of attendance requirements in general. To this end, we have provided each family with some printed information around the attendance of students in Department of Education schools. Families are reminded to inform the school of the reason for absence within seven days of the first day of absence and to limit absences to those that are necessary.

Did you know that if a child misses 5 minutes a day that they will have lost 3 days of learning by the end of the year? Being on time allows children the opportunity to catch up with friends before school starts and feel less anxious as they know what is happening in the day ahead.

Year 6 to 7 Transition

It is the time of year that our Year 6 students begin the transition to high school process. This year, the students will be involved in Taster lessons in Term 3 and an Orientation day in Term 4. Permission notes will be sent home this week.

Changes to Notes

From this week, permission notes for sporting activities have undergone a change in format. This is to allow us to provide more detailed information around concussion and insurance. We ask that you read the notes carefully before filling out and signing them. We will continue to see some changes in the format of notes for other activities as the year progresses.

<u>Have You Enrolled Your Child For Kindergarten in</u> 2023?

We are asking that all applications to enrol in Kindergarten in 2023 are provided to the school as soon as possible to ensure that you are advised of any Orientation to School activities in Term 4. Applications for non-local placements are welcome but are not a guarantee of acceptance. Our enrolment committee will meet later this term to determine acceptance of placement and parents will be notified in the last week of this term. Word of the Week

Did You know?

Dictionary meaning Ineffable is used to describe something that is indescribable or unspeakable and that cannot be expressed in words. It is also used for things which are taboo and are not to be uttered.

// Ed felt an ineffable joy at the sight of his daughter walking toward him from the plane. Reading Douglass's words, it's clear that ineffable means "indescribable" or "unspeakable." And when we break the word down to its Latin roots, we see how those meanings came about. Ineffable comes from ineffābilis, which joins the prefix in-, meaning "not," with the adjective effābilis, meaning "capable of being expressed." Effābilis comes from effārī, "to speak out," which in turn comes from ex- and fārī, meaning "to speak."
