

Principal's Report



Yesterday, our school hosted a debating workshop for students across the greater Armidale area. Fifteen of our students, supported by Mrs Woods, participated in a range of activities to develop their debating skills. The day finished with students testing out their arguments against students from other schools. Students will have the opportunity to utilise their skills with upcoming debates.

Today, our school cricket team took part in the first round of competition against a team from Guyra Central School. This is the first Knockout competition to be played for 2023. There are a range of other sports to be played as part of the NSWPSSA Knockouts.

Service NSW Back to School vouchers

We have been advised that the Premier's Back to School voucher program has been extended to include payment of school excursions. This means that families will be able to use up to three \$50 Service NSW

Back to School vouchers to help pay for excursions for any eligible students before 30 June 2023. These vouchers can be used on Stage 2 or Stage 3 excursions, as these cost more than \$50. If you have not used all of your Back to School vouchers already, this could help make overnight excursions more affordable for your family.

Information about the Year 3 overnight camp at Thalgarrah will be provided in the next couple of days. Please return notes by the due date to secure a place.

Knives at school

In the last week, we have seen some students bringing dinner knives in their lunch boxes for the purpose of cutting up food. An attached parent factsheet states that there is no good reason for a student to bring a knife to school. Parents are asked to ensure that food is cut ready for eating and NOT allow students to bring a knife, including a Stanley knife or a craft knife, to school. Following is some information that can be found in a parent fact sheet included in this week's newsletter:

...If a student is found to be possessing or carrying a knife at school the principal may call the police. The student may also be expelled or suspended from school immediately.

Possessing a knife includes a student having one in their bag or locker, even if they do not use it or threaten anyone with it. Having a knife for self-protection is also illegal. Any wellbeing or safety concerns should be escalated to the Principal.

Parents and carers are advised not to send butter knives or fruit knives in lunchboxes, or knife tools for craft purposes. In lessons requiring the use of knives, for example cooking or trades, the student's teacher will supply and supervise the use of the tools.

Every student has the right to feel safe and secure at school. There is no good reason for a student to ever have a knife at school...



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

Register and turn up to the Aussie Hoops session for rookie players 5 -12 years

10 - 11am Sundays from 5 February to 2 April (9 weeks)

Both new and returning players should register online at www.aussiehoops.com.au. At the home page, click on 'Find your state'; enter 2350 in the postcode Search box, then click on the location 'Armidale Secondary College'. This takes you to the registration page. The cost for new players is \$100 for the 9-week term (includes basketball, personalised training singlet and backpack) while returning players will pay \$65 (no kit). Other merchandise is available for purchase, but they cannot be paid for by AKVs.

Aussie Hoops is Basketball Australia's official junior game development program for children in primary school. They learn basketball in a structured, inclusive and fun environment, developing fitness, skills and an understanding of the sport. The Aussie Hoops program aims to give children the basic skills they need to progress to and enjoy playing actual games.

Armidale Basketball is an Active Kids Provider so you can use the Active Kids Vouchers to help pay for the activity. Carefully follow the directions when registering your child (don't forget to press the Validate button after you put in the voucher number). Switch off the screen & get active!

Limiting the time spent sitting or lying down, especially in front of screens, helps children grow and develop good habits for life.

Australia's physical activity and sedentary behaviour guidelines recommend no more than ${\bf 2}$ hours of sedentary recreational screen time per day.

Effects of too much screen time:

- Poor posture
 Poor eyesight
 Strains of the thumb, wrist and elbow
- Sleep problems
 Delayed ability to make social connections
- · Becoming overweight



Physical activity makes children stronger and fitter, they can also concentrate and learn better at school, as well as sleep better at night.


Encourage children to turn off the screen and opt for at least **60 minutes** of daily physical activity instead.
