
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#### **Principal's Report**



Congratulations to Stage 3 students on leading by example as they demonstrated what it means to *excel with honour* during their week-long excursion last week. The feedback has been very positive with the behaviour of our students leading to some venues requesting that we come back. It makes me extremely proud to learn that some of our students showed their gratitude for the staff of at least one accommodation venue by leaving notes of thanks and treats. I was also thankful that our students treated their teachers and other students with respect and ensured that everyone was able to get sufficient sleep to recharge for the next day of activities.

Students who did not attend the Stage 3 excursion were involved in learning and a range of exciting activities from building castles to making individual scones. It was wonderful to see most attend each day with a positive attitude and willingness to have a go.

We have had a number of students from our school representing the school at regional and state events this term. In the last week, we had a team of four students attend the finals of a state chess competition that was mostly completed online. The team placed third.

In addition, three Tournament of Minds (ToM) teams travelled to Sydney on Saturday to compete at the state competition. The teams were made up of students from Year 4 to Year 6. While our Arts and Social Sciences teams did not place, they did an amazing job. The Language Literature team were awarded gold medals and will be competing as members of the New South Wales team at the Nationals event, which is also an international competition as it includes teams from New Zealand, Indonesia, Hong Kong and the United Arab Emirates at the end of October. Our thanks go to the parents who accompanied the three teams and especially **Ms Raftery** who has organised the trip and helped prepare all three teams for their competition. The Stage 3 students and Ms Raftery had spent a week away on excursion to then hop a train back to Sydney for the ToM competition – such dedication!

Thanks also go to the teachers for providing material to allow **Ms Joyce** to keep families updated via the school Facebook page with photos from the excursion, chess and ToM in the past week. This is a mammoth task that is greatly appreciated by families who have been wondering what students have been up to.

This Friday sees students in Year 12 finish thirteen years of learning. Though they have been gone from our school for six years, many of these students remain in our thoughts. We wish them well as they attend their valedictory celebrations and prepare for their exams next term.










# Armidale City Cookbook

#### INGREDIENTS

- 2 large sweet potatoes, cut into wedges
- Olive oil spray
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1 teaspoon rosemary or thyme, finely chopped (optional)

#### DIRECTIONS

- Preheat oven to 180°C. Line baking tray with baking paper.
- Place sweet potato wedges on baking tray.
- 3. Lightly spray wedges with olive oil spray.
- 4. Sprinkle with salt, pepper and fresh herbs.
- Bake for 30 minutes or until cooked through and brown.

Add cooled sweet potato wedges to the lunchbox with hummus or avocado and bean dip!




